# Costs for Registration:

**Early Registration**: An initial deposit of 50 AED -Applicable from the 18<sup>th</sup> of October to the 12<sup>th</sup> of November 2020.

**Normal Registration:** An initial deposit of AED 100 -Applicable from the 13<sup>th</sup> of November to the 17<sup>th</sup> of December 2020.

**Advisory Fee:** For every 20 delegates, 1 free advisor is permitted. Any additional advisor will be charged a fee of AED 100.

**Note:** We are monitoring the situation with **COVID-19** and are consistently communicating with our faculty advisers to ensure that AUSMUN 2021 takes place in accordance with the respected guidelines and safety precautions. However, if the conference took place on campus then an additional fee of **AED 100** will apply to the deposited amount.


## Deadlines:

- Name changes and name amendments will not be permitted after 17<sup>th</sup> of December 2020.
- No applications will be accepted after the 17<sup>th</sup> of December 2020.

#### General Information:

- Schools are not permitted to bring their own photographers nor observers.
- For international delegates, hotel and airfare booking is their own responsibility. However, we highly recommend "Centro Rotana Hotel" due to its close proximity to the American University of Sharjah campus. The hotel is around 10 minutes away
  - from "Sharjah International Airport". The price range is around 300AED- 800 AED per night inclusive of breakfast.
